

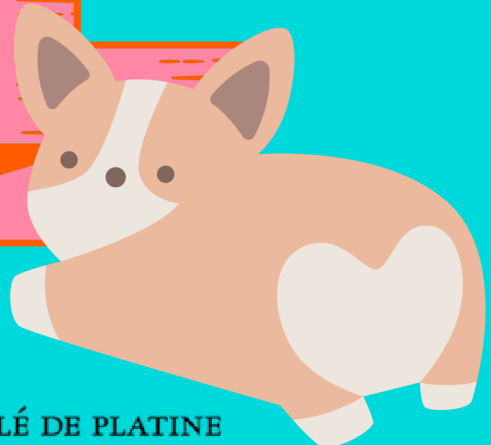

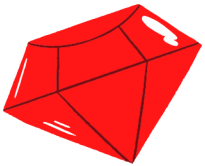
The Queen's Platinum Jubilee

Silver for 25 years.



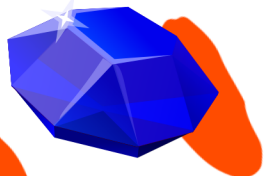
Ruby for 40 years.

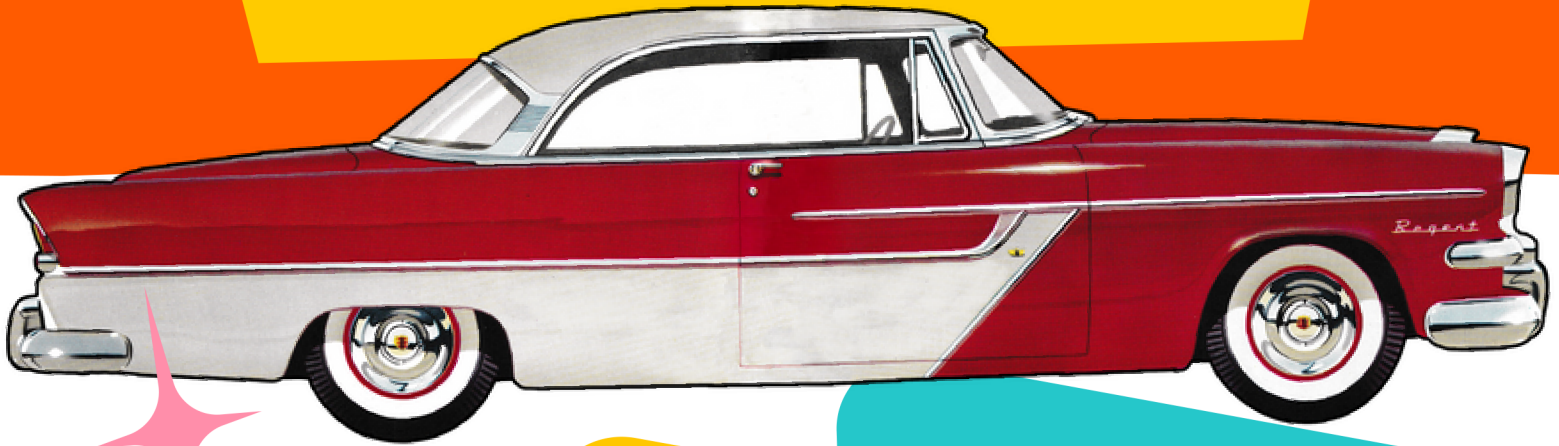

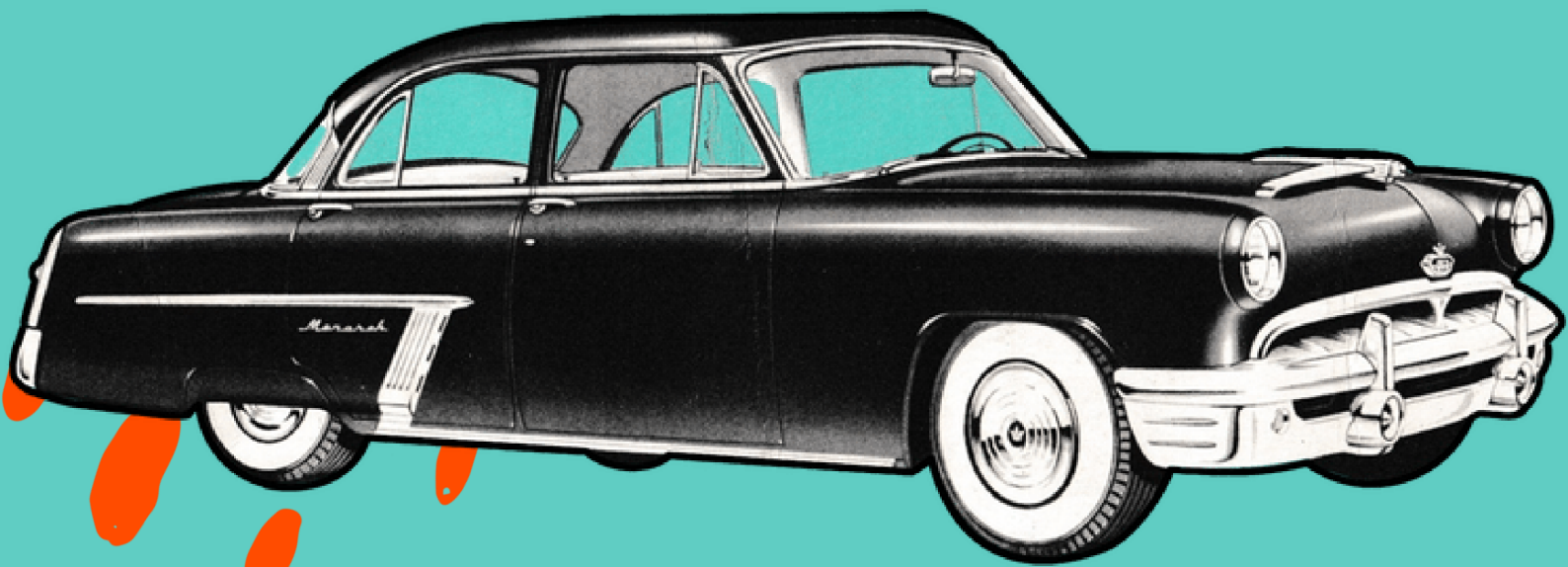

Crown Victoria



Many vehicles have been named after Queen Victoria. Queen Victoria was the longest reigning queen until Queen Elizabeth surpassed her in 2015.

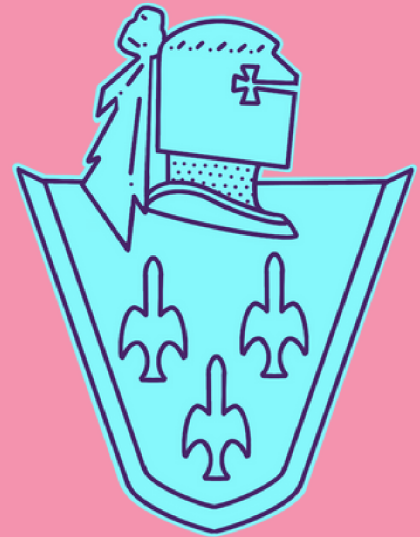
Emblems are images used to represent brands, places, people, and events.

An emblem will usually tell us something about what it represents.



The Monarch emblem is a crown on a pillow. The crown tells us that this emblem represents something royal.

The Regent emblem is a knight with a shield. These images tell us that they represent something dependable and protective.



The Queen's Platinum Jubilee emblem is a seven sided shape with seven maple leaves and seven pearls. These represent the seventy years of Queen Elizabeth's reign. The emblem uses Canada's national colours, and is topped with the royal crown.

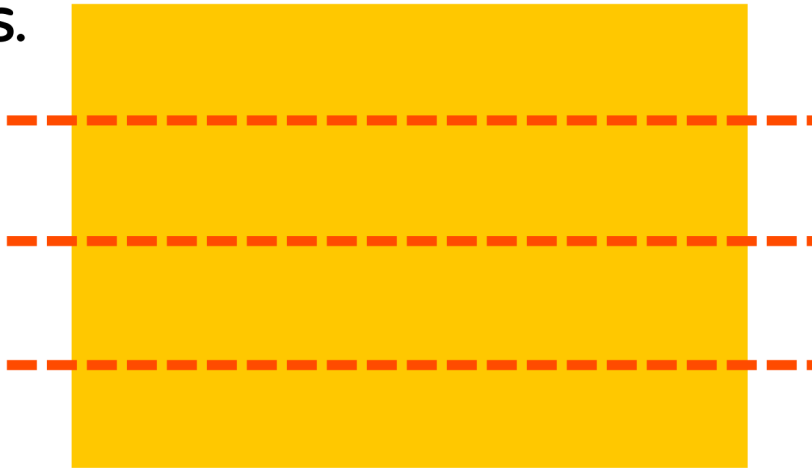
Celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in style with a custom crown of your creation!

Supplies: construction paper
pencil
ruler
scissors
glue
decorations (crayons, stickers, etc!)

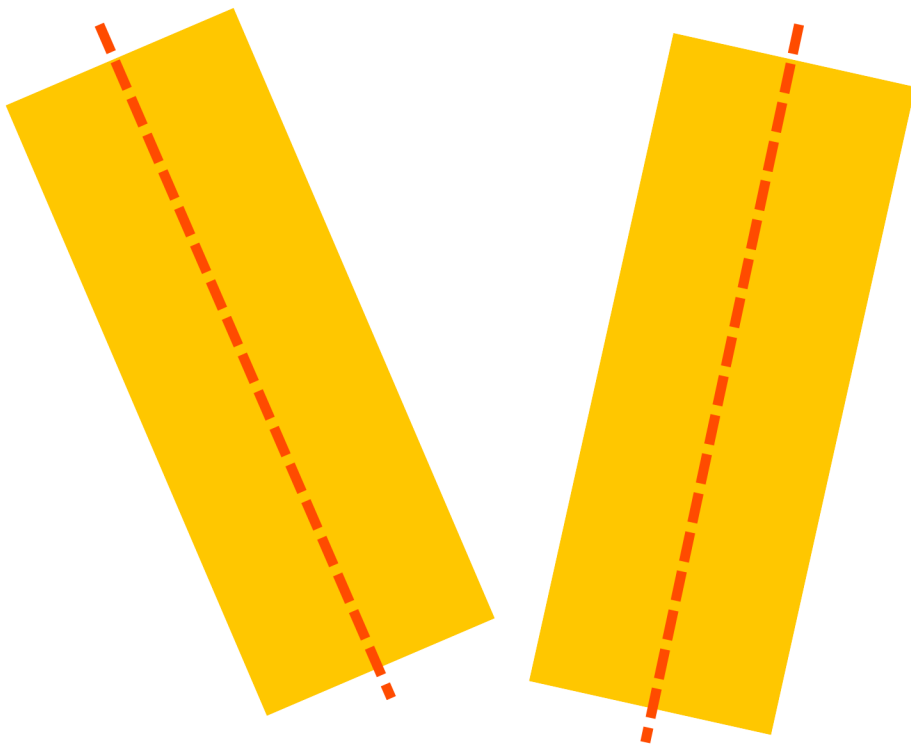


1 Fold your construction paper in half the long way, like a hot dog.

2 Fold the paper in half the long way again. When you open the paper you will have 4 sections.

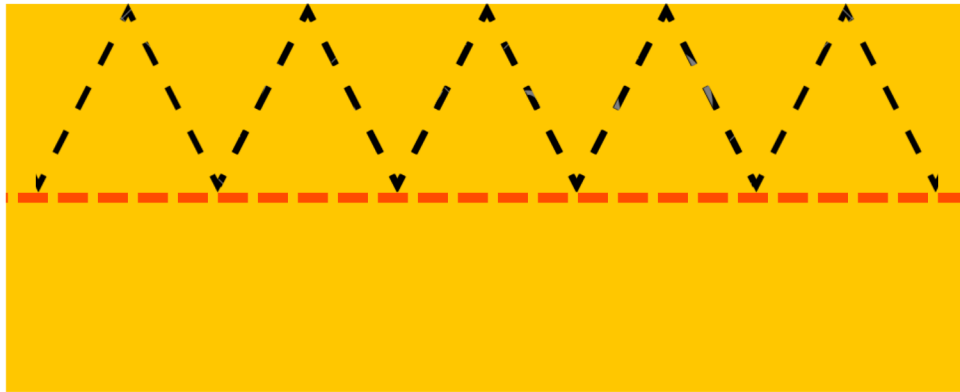


3 Cut the construction paper in half along the middle crease.



4.

On one of the pieces you cut use your pencil and ruler to draw a row of triangles in one segment.



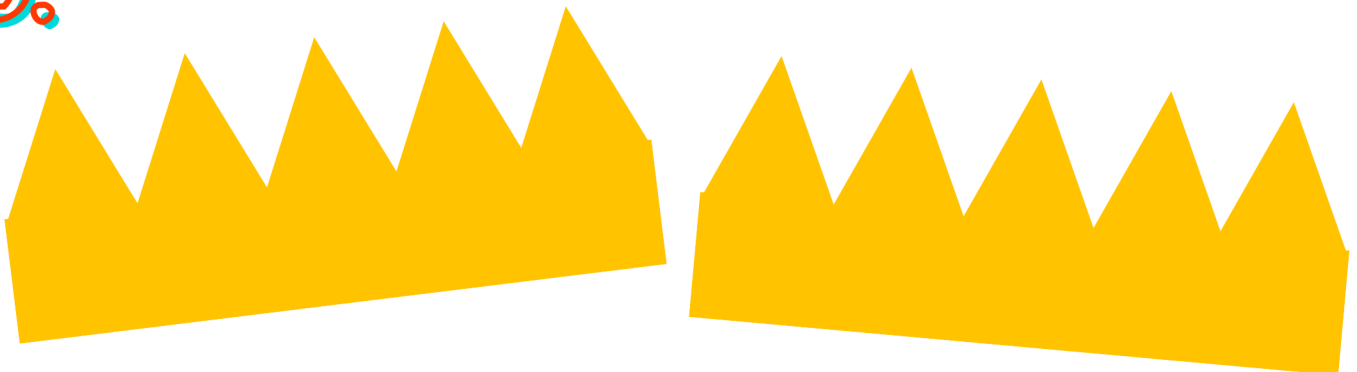
5.

Cut out the triangles you've drawn. Your paper will look like this when you're finished cutting:



6.

Repeat steps 4 and 5 for the second piece.



7. Glue the edges of the pieces together in a long strip.



8. Decorate your crown! You can use any craft supplies you have on hand.



9. Once your crown is decorated glue the remaining two edges together so your crown makes a circle shape.

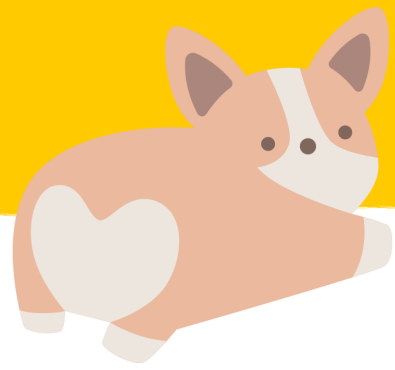


10. Put on your crown and enjoy!
